NAPEG Agreement with Notarius for Digital Signatures

At the July meeting of NAPEG Council, there was agreement to offer digital signatures to NAPEG registrants practicing in the Northwest Territories and Nunavut. The Executive Director signed the agreement with Notarius on July 16, 2020.

Since that time, NAPEG staff have been trained in the procedure to follow within NAPEG. The Professional Practice Committee and Council reviewed and revised the *Authentication of Documents, Use of Professional Stamps or Digital Signatures* document. The ability to use Digital Signatures for Northwest Territories and Nunavut projects had been requested by several registrants. Council Members and the Executive Director/Registrar are very happy to have been able to reach this agreement at this difficult time of practicing during a pandemic.

In the same way that NAPEG controls issuing the ink stamp, the partnership with Notarius allows NAPEG to be the exclusive issuer of a Digital Signature. We are ready to **launch on Tuesday, September 1, 2020**.

What is a digital signature?

It is the affixing of a digital signature certificate that cryptographically secures an electronic file, thus proving the origin, the authenticity of the signer, and confirms the integrity of the signed document.

What is an electronic document?

An electronic document is a document carried by electronic, logical and visual media.

What is a digital signature certificate?

It is a computer artefact issued and cryptographically protected by a Certificate Authority (Notarius) attesting to the veracity of the information declared in the certificate. This information may include:

- Full name;
- Email address;
- Professional title;
- Membership number;
- Public key;
 - Validity period and the serial number of their certificate.

NAPEG Reinstatement Policy

The term "reinstatement" refers to the readmission of a Professional Member, Professional Licensee, Member-in-Training, or Permit Holder who had been a registrant of NAPEG at some time in the past and whose registration had lapsed.

The policy applies to registrants who have resigned, been cancelled and/or registrants who have been struck from the register.

The NAPEG Reinstatement Policy, as follows, provides a clear, fair and consistent guideline for reinstatement and provides assistance to the Membership and Enforcement Committee and Executive Director/Registrar in making recommendation to Council.

- A request for reinstatement must be accompanied by a completed and signed application form, current resume, government issued identification, and the application fee, if circumstance require payment of the application fee (as below).
- Staff will confirm standing of the applicant in other Canadian jurisdictions based on where the applicant is/ has been licensed to practice. The applicant identifies other jurisdictions on the application form.
- The application fee will be waived if the registrant resigned in good standing within the previous two years (24 months). If it has been more than two years, the applicant must include the application fee with the request outlined in (a).
- The application fee will not be waived if the registrant was struck from the register.
- If an applicant has a restriction on their practice in another jurisdiction, NAPEG will enforce that restriction until the registrant can show that the matter is resolved and the other jurisdiction confirms.
- An applicant for reinstatement who has not been registered in a Canadian jurisdiction at any time in the
 previous five years (60 months) may have their file forwarded to the Board of Examiners and, when forwarded, the applicant will have their qualifications examined by the Board of Examiners and may be assigned
 examinations.

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Annual Dues Policy

Section 27 (1) of *Engineering and Geoscience Professions Act* states that "a registrant or permit holder shall pay in advance to the Association the annual fee fixed under the bylaws."

Sections 18 and 19 of the bylaws state that annual fees for members, licensees and permit holders shall be specified from time to time by Council and shall be payable in advance, on January 1 or each year, subject to such discount as Council may from time to time direct.

Further, the bylaws allow for the annual fee to be prorated for new applicants in accordance with the portion of the calendar year remaining.

All registrants on the register in October of each year shall be invoiced for the upcoming year. - Invoices will be available to registrants through their on-line account on, or before, November 1 of each year.

New registrants in November and December will be invoiced for .25 of annual dues for the current year and 100% of annual dues for the next year.

For registrants registered throughout the calendar year, annual dues are invoiced at the time the registrant is officially approved by Council. Annual dues are prorated on the following basis:

Registration taking place

January, February and MarchFull yearApril, May and June3⁄4 yearJuly, August and September1⁄2 yearOctober, November and December1⁄4 year

Annual dues payments, not received within 60 days of the invoice date, shall be subject to a late payment fee at a rate approved by Council.

Annual dues payments, not received within 90 days of the invoice date, Council may direct the Executive Director to terminate the registration (Section 27.2).

Deferral of annual dues means to postpone payment to a mutually agreed date. A suggested date might be 90 days from the date of the request if an exact date is not known. Go to the full policy on the website to see the process to apply for deferral.

Resignation and Reinstatement

A registrant, who is not practicing in the Northwest Territories and/or Nunavut <u>and</u> does not want to remain on the register, may resign in good standing and apply for reinstatement as required. There is no application fee to pay so long as reinstatement is within two years; however, documentation must be completed, registration approved, and annual dues must be paid to resume practice.

Non-Practising Member/Licensee

A Non-Practising Member/Licensee pays partial annual dues at a rate that is determined annually by Council. While maintaining an affiliation with NAPEG, <u>practice is not allowed</u> in the Northwest Territories and Nunavut until they have requested the change to Active, are approved by Council as an Active Member or Licensee, and have paid the full annual dues for that calendar year. To remain as non-practicing status, the registrant must provide a declaration each year.

Annual dues are not refunded if a registrant resigns during the current year. Full dues are considered to be paid until December 31 of the current year. The resignation will be taken to Council for acceptance at the next Council meeting after the resignation is received by the Registrar. Once accepted, the registrant shall not practice the remainder of the year unless they reinstate to an Active status.

Note: This annual dues policy does not apply to Life Members or Distinguished Life Members.
