

GRADUATE STUDIES SCHOLARSHIP TERMS OF REFERENCE

General

The Northwest Territories and Nunavut Association of Professional Engineers and Geoscientists (NAPEG) Education Foundation may award up to two scholarships per year in the amount of seven thousand five hundred dollars (\$7,500.00) each. The purpose is to provide financial assistance to Northwest Territories or Nunavut resident member engineers and geoscientists who are furthering their studies in engineering or geoscience.

Objectives

The NAPEG encourages the achievement of excellence in the engineering and geosciences professions through the promotion of advanced studies and research programs by providing financial assistance to engineers and geoscientists returning to university for further study in a Master's or PhD program.

The objectives of the scholarships are to:

- 1) promote the professions of Engineering and Geoscience to the Northwest Territories and Nunavut residents as established and respected careers;
- 2) recognize and financially assist NAPEG members enrolled in a recognized program leading to a post-graduate university degree in engineering or geoscience; and
- 3) increase public awareness of NAPEG as an organization actively concerned about encouraging all people in the engineering and geoscience professions, present and future community leadership through its membership, and the continued growth of the professions in the Northwest Territories and Nunavut.

Eligibility

Applicant must be a NAPEG member-in-training and registered as a full-time student for the following academic year.

Selection Criteria

Selection of the scholarship recipients will be based only on information provided with the application. No restrictions are placed on scholarship recipients holding other grants or awards or receiving assistance or income from other sources.

The scholarships are attributed on the basis of (not necessarily placed in order of importance):

- a) academic achievements
- b) professional work achievements
- c) community volunteer experience and achievements

Application

The applicant must complete the attached Scholarship Application Form.

Application Closing Date

The scholarships will be advertised for eligible candidates commencing May of each year.

Applications must be received by August 15th.

Final decision for awarding the scholarship will be made by the NAPEG Education Foundation in September of the same year.

The NAPEG Council has the right to decide the number of scholarships awarded each year.

Preference will be given to highly motivated individuals with a strong academic background and demonstrated community and leadership capabilities.

Your total submission including this application should not exceed 15 pages.
